Subject: GHRP July update – follow-up on country inputs and monitoring framework

Dear colleagues,

I am writing to follow up on the message you received from USG Lowcock on Friday, 5 June, with additional information about the next iteration of the Global Humanitarian Response Plan (GHRP) for COVID-19.

I am pleased to share with you the following:

1. Country inputs template

Responding to feedback from the field, we have shortened the template; focused it more on context updates, collective achievements and operational challenges; refined the way in which financial requirements are presented; and requested the inclusion of concrete examples of results, including by NGO partners.

We would kindly request that the completed template be returned **by Monday 29 June 5pm CET:**

- For countries **with an OCHA country office**, the office will support you in coordinating preparation of the inputs and their submission to HQ.
- For countries **without an in-country OCHA Office**, the relevant OCHA Regional Office can support you in coordinating preparation of the inputs and facilitating their submission to HQ.

2. Monitoring framework

There have been a number of questions on the monitoring framework. OCHA has been working with agency partners to finalise the overarching GHRP Monitoring Framework and organize data collection. Monitoring focal points in agencies have refined the indicators and made sure they are able to be reported against on a regular basis. The final monitoring framework has been integrated into the annotated outline for the GHRP, which is attached only for your reference. This document is also being shared with agency HQs through the IASC-EDG.

As discussed by IASC Principals, **those UN agencies with indicators in the framework will be responsible for data collection at country-level**, before sharing with their respective HQs. Agencies will aggregate their global data and share the results with OCHA. We expect that country offices should be contacted by their agency HQ to start the data collection process.

The first 'round' of aggregated global indicators will be due on **Monday 29 June 5pm CET**, integrated into the broader agency GHRP submissions at HQ. Overall, agencies should aim to collect data on a regular basis so that this may be shared with donors.

As in previous iterations of the GHRP, we will be working through the IASC-EDG to facilitate the agency submissions.
