#### Analysing and Communicating Information for a Humanitarian Nutrition Response

Aggregates and analyses need assessments and monitoring data, maintains accurate records, acknowledges the needs and views of vulnerable and hard to reach populations, and shares information in appropriate and accessible formats with the cluster and other stakeholders as relevant, encourages a transparent flow of information between partners.

Works with cluster partners to define key advocacy messages and create and implement an advocacy strategy aligned with the nutrition cluster strategy and response plan, based on an analysis of needs assessment and monitoring data; networks with advocacy allies and targets to achieve the aims of the cluster's advocacy strategy.

Strengthening National Capacity to Respond and Lead in a Humanitarian Nutrition Response



Supports, strengthens, and builds national NiE preparedness and response capacity. Leads an effective nutrition response by supporting the development of technical and operational capacity of national and local, state and non-state organisations, by working through and engaging with national and sub-national coordination mechanisms, when appropriate, and by encouraging the active participation of national and local actors in the nutrition cluster.
