



Simplified Approaches and Family MUAC

Simplified approaches for the detection and treatment of child wasting

What are "simplified approaches"

- Number of adaptations to the existing national and global protocols for the management of child wasting
- They are designed to improve effectiveness, quality, coverage and reduce the costs of caring for children with uncomplicated wasting.


- 1. Family MUAC
- 2. CHW-led treatment of Wasting
- 3. Reduced Frequency of Follow-up Visits
- 4. MUAC and/or oedema only
- 5. Expanded admissions criteria
- 6. Use of a single treatment product
- 7. Modified Dosage






Evidence base of simplified approaches

Selection of simplified approaches according to the context




Where are we with Family MUAC

What is Family MUAC: mothers, fathers and other caregivers are trained to identify wasting in their children using a mid-upper arm circumference (MUAC) tape and by checking for oedema.



Objective: increasing the frequency and coverage of screening for wasting and ultimately detecting more children with wasting for early referral.



- Family MUAC is the most implemented simplified approach
- There are 3 countries with peer review evidence, but more than 30 with operational evidence regarding effectiveness, cost, coverage and quality of the approach

Background on the Training Toolkit

Technical desk review and learning needs analysis (LNA)

Objectives: to compile and analyse existing Simplified Approaches training materials and associated resources to provide recommendations for the development of a training toolkit, including

- Describe what training and other relevant materials already exist
- Identify any areas of technical discrepancy and / or gaps in existing materials
- Identify if there are existing ways to structure a trainer manual
- Identify if we know what works when it comes to trainer manual design on Simplified Approaches

Reflections on simplified approaches and implications for the training toolkit

Context will always remain important to select which simplification(s) are implemented, in what combination and how

Training manual needs to reflect and respond to this flexibility, but also needs to be easy to navigate / use

Technical protocol and programme design decisions need to be made (likely not by the trainers) that will affect who is trained, on what, and how







For training modules, develop specific 'protocol choices' should be provided, based on most likely use cases (trainers, service provided / training audiences and protocols) with options for adaptation provided

Arrange around who (trainer and training audience) and what (simplified approach)

In addition to training materials, include orientation section for programme decision makers

How the toolkit was developed

Methods

- Built of existing materials where available
- Technically reviewed by global Simplified Approaches Working group
- Incorporated adult learning best practices

Limitations

- The final harmonised training package has not been implemented with users, but is based on materials that have been implemented
- As more evidence emerges on the feasibility and effectiveness of different elements of these protocols, certain elements may need to be updated and adjusted, including the up coming updated WHO guidance on the prevention and treatment of child wasting

Always review the content thoroughly and adapt for your context




ATTENTION!

Before you go to deliver this training, make sure you know:

- the nutritional recommendations for infants and children in your area,
- the nearest transfer and referral centres for the local community where you are going to train,
- whether moderate wasting is treated by the local nutrition service or whether it treats only severe wasting and nutritional oedema (with moderate wasting managed at home).




