
Objective and Vision

Vision: a nutrition sector that ensures racial equity, local leadership, and space in humanitarian actors preparedness, response, and recovery

Conceptualizing Anti-racism & Localisation

Anti-racism shifting to a locally-driven, locally-Localisation A locallyled, and locally-owned response driven humanitarian response reconstitution of ways of thinking, **Decoloniality** languages, ways of life and being Racial equity in the humanitarian **Dismantling** by de-centering whiteness and sector challenging assumptions of neutrality white supremacy

The A&L WG conceptualises the relationship between anti-racism and localisation using the conceptual framework above. This theory of change positions antiracism as the overarching proactive course of action with the three main approaches relevant to our work of localisation, decoloniality, and the dismantling of white supremacy.
